By Kyoto City Bus: the journey will take approximately 30-35 minutes. The cost is 220 yen.

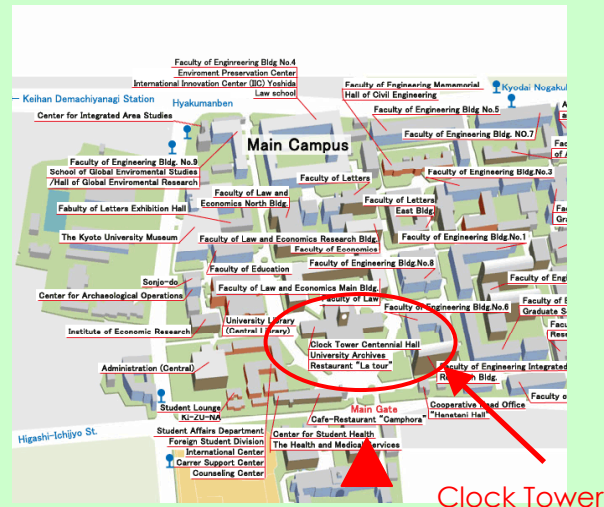

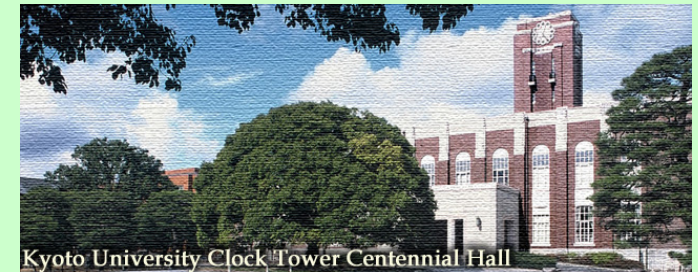

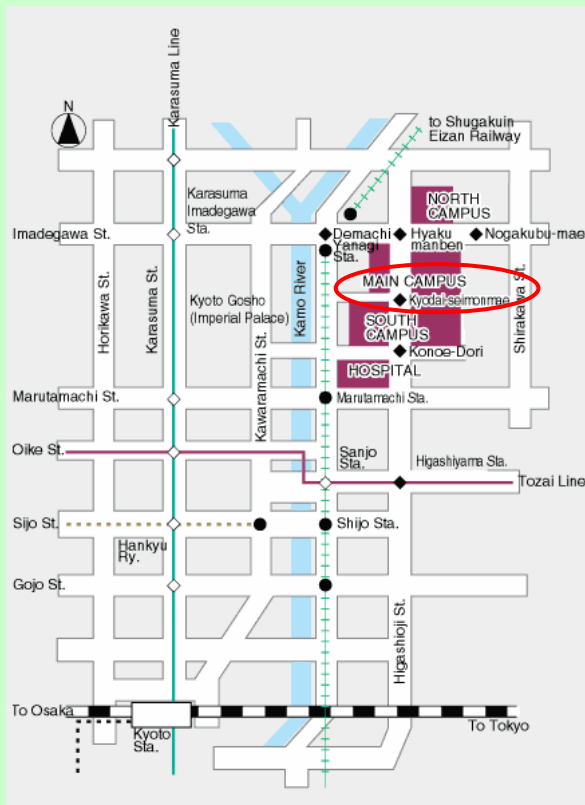
